EXHIBITION OF PHOTOGRAPHY FEATURING WORLD RENOWNED ASSOCIATED  
PRESS PULITZER PRIZE-WINNING IMAGES**

***Neal Ulevich, Pulitzer Prize Winning Associated Press Photographer, to Speak at Opening of  
GALLERY M's Exclusive Photography Exhibition, "Documents of Our Time"***

DENVER .... April 24, 2002 ... GALLERY M of Cherry Creek North announced today the upcoming opening of an exclusive photography exhibition, *Documents of Our Time*, featuring images from The Associated Press Pulitzer Prize Collection, The LIFE Picture Collection and other sources. The collections represent some of the world's most recognizable photographs spanning the 20<sup>th</sup> Century, including a selection of Pulitzer Prize winners being released to the public for purchase as limited edition photographs for the first time. In addition to the Pulitzer Prize-winning photographs, the selling exhibition includes other memorable photographs taken by a variety of photographers.

GALLERY M is one of the first galleries in the nation and the first in the Rocky Mountain region to offer this exclusive collection of more than 60 photographs. The exhibit will be on display for public viewing and purchasing at GALLERY M, 2830 E. 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue in Cherry Creek North, Denver, from Friday, May 3-July 31, 2002. Grand opening events for the public will be held Friday, May 3, 2002, 5:30 p.m. to 9 p.m. MT and Saturday, May 4, 2002, 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. MT.

To help celebrate the initial unveiling of this collection, Neal Ulevich, a Pulitzer Prize-winning Associated Press photographer and Denver resident, will speak at both of GALLERY M's opening events about his experiences photographing historic events. Ulevich took pictures for The Associated Press in Vietnam from 1970 to 1975. At the end of the war, he moved to Bangkok, Thailand, where he worked as AP's regional photographer. He won the Pulitzer Prize for news photography in 1977 for photos taken during a political upheaval in Bangkok. Reservations for these events are recommended. A selection of historic Pulitzer Prize-winning AP photographs are included in this selling exhibition, such as:

- Joe Rosenthal's 1945 photograph of U.S. troops raising the American flag at Iwo Jima
- Alexander Zemlianichenko's 1991 photograph of The KGB statue toppled during the Soviet coup in Moscow
- Paul Vathis' photograph of Kennedy and Eisenhower at Camp David in 1961
- Stephan Savoia's photograph of Clinton silhouetted against an American flag during the 1992 U.S. Election Campaign

- The 2001 “Flag Rising at Ground Zero” (Pulitzer Prize Runner Up), signed by photographer, Tom Franklin
- The 1948 “The Babe Bows Out” (Pulitzer Prize Winner) by Nat Fein
- The 1960 photograph of Presidential Candidate JFK with brother Bobby, signed by LIFE Magazine photographer, Hank Walker

A variety of photographs dating back to 1869 will also be featured.

The Associated Press has been honored with the Pulitzer Prize for Photography 28 times since the award was first established in 1942. Founded in 1848 and headquartered in New York, The Associated Press ([www.ap.org](http://www.ap.org)) is the world's oldest and largest news gathering organization, providing coverage of news, sports, business, weather, entertainment, political news and technology news in text, audio, video, graphics, photos and newsroom technology to more than 15,000 news outlets worldwide with a daily reach of one billion people around the world. The photographs from The LIFE Picture Collection, taken by some of LIFE Magazine's most famous staff photographers, include images from staff photographers, Alfred Eisenstaedt, Margaret Bourke-White, Carl Mydans, Peter Stackpole and Thomas MacElvoy, and span 2100 issues, beginning with the magazine's inception in 1936.
